

POWER COUNTY COMMISSIONER MINUTES

The Board of Power County Commissioners met in regular session on September 13, 1999. Present were Kent Rudeen, Chairman, Ken Estep and Valerie Hoybjerg. Also present were Power County Clerk Christine Steinlicht and County Civil Attorney Rob Naftz.

PLANNING & ZONING: Richard Wiles appeared before the Commissioners to discuss the problems with the accessory dwelling permit issued to Terry Anderson d/b/a Indian Springs Natatorium to set up a trailer house on his property. Moved by Commissioner Estep, seconded by Commissioner Rudeen, to put a stop work order on the accessory dwelling permit issued to Terry Anderson d/b/a Indian Springs Natatorium until the appeal hearing on September 27, 1999. Carried.

WEEDS: Curtis Munk, Power County Weed Control supervisor appeared before the Commissioners to discuss putting old past due accounts on 1999 tax bills. Moved by Estep, seconded by Hoybjerg to add past due weed billings to 1999 tax bills on the following accounts:

EXECUTIVE SESSION: Moved by Commissioner Hoybjerg, seconded by Commissioner Estep, to move into executive session for the purpose of taking up indigent medical applications. Carried.

INDIGENT (#99-17-I): Moved by Commissioner Hoybjerg, seconded by Commissioner Estep, to deny the indigent medical application in Case #99-17-I since other resources for payment of these bills are available to applicant. Carried.

CASCADE EARTH SCIENCES: Rich Gallucci from Cascade Earth Sciences appeared before the Commissioners to discuss prevention of run-off problems at the old Power County Landfill. The Commissioners and Mr. Gallucci performed an on-site inspection of the old Power County Landfill.

ENHANCED 911 SERVICES: Di Armstrong from the Power County Sheriff's Office appeared before the Commissioners to discuss the

Enhanced 911 "kick off" meeting between U.S. West and the Power County Sheriff's office, which was held on September 8, 1999.

TAX CANCELLATIONS: Moved by Rudeen, seconded by Estep, to approve and sign the Order for Cancellation of Taxes as presented by the Power County Treasurer in the total amount of \$2,479.96. Carried.

BEVERAGE LICENSE: Commissioner Rudeen then announced it was the date and time for consideration of a beverage license. Chairman Rudeen read the application into the record. There being no public objection, it was moved by Commissioner Rudeen, seconded by Commissioner Hoybjerg, to approve transfer of the liquor and beer license of Mike Smith and Kerry Bock d/b/a Time Out, to Mike Smith d/b/a Time Out, for draught and bottled and canned beer to be consumed on the premises, as well as retail liquor. Carried.

PUBLIC DEFENDER: The Commissioners reviewed the report submitted by Henry Boomer, Keith Zollinger and David Kress, the three attorney panel appointed by Sixth District Administrative Judge William H. Woodland to review the public defender applications and make recommendations for interviews. Interviews will be scheduled for Friday, September 17, 1999.
