

POWER COUNTY COMMISSIONER MINUTES

The Board of Power County Commissioners met in special session on August 7, 2000. Present were Commissioners Kent Rudeen, Chairman, Ken Estep and Valerie Hoybjerg. Also present was Power County Clerk Christine Steinlicht.

CITY/COUNTY COMMUNITY WORK SERVICE AGREEMENT: Jerrie Boyce appeared before the Commissioners on behalf of the City of American Falls. Mrs. Boyce indicated that the Mayor and City Council had decided not to renew the City/County Community Work Service Agreement for FY 2001.

BUILDING ADMINISTRATOR/PLANNING & ZONING: Power County Building Administrator Richard Wiles appeared before the Commissioners to discuss the status of the proposed Planning & Zoning fee resolution. The Commissioners and Mr. Wiles then discussed Mr. Wiles' responsibilities under the Agreement of Cooperative Action regarding inspection of building activities within the City limits of Rockland, Idaho. Mr. Wiles was instructed to render building inspection and enforcement services only when Rockland City officials request assistance or enforcement.

POWER COUNTY WATERWAYS: The Commissioners then reviewed Ron Anderson's request for paying Waterway employees. Moved by Commissioner Rudeen, seconded by Commissioner Estep, to pay waterway employees as contract labor rather than through the County payroll system. Carried.

SEARCH & RESCUE BUILDING: Pete Williams appeared before the Commissioners with the bids for the Power County Search & Rescue equipment storage building. Clerk Steinlicht will contact the Power County Press to publish a call for bids for a 40' X 65' X 14' steel, pre-engineered equipment storage building. Sealed bids will be accepted by the Power County Clerk until 5:00 o'clock p.m. on August 25th, 2000. Bid opening has been scheduled for August 28th, 2000, at 2:00 p.m. Commissioner Rudeen will attend the next City Council meeting to discuss the transfer of the property from the City of American Falls to Power County.

AMBULANCE: Moved by Commissioner Estep, seconded by Commissioner Rudeen, to recess as Power County Board of Commissioners and reconvene as Power County Ambulance District Board. Carried.

The Commissioners reviewed the proposed contract with Medical Solutions for ambulance billing services. Moved by Commissioner Estep, seconded by Commissioner Rudeen, to approve the Contract as presented. Carried.

Moved by Commissioner Hoybjerg, seconded by Commissioner Estep, to recess as Power County Ambulance District Board and reconvene as Power County Board of Commissioners. Carried.

MINUTES: Moved by Commissioner Estep, seconded by Commissioner Rudeen, to approve the Minutes for July 10th and 24th as presented. Carried.

TRANSFER STATION: Power County Transfer Station Supervisor Craig Heward appeared before the Commissioners to discuss closing the transfer station on Saturday, August 11th, 2000, for the American Falls Days celebration. The Commissioners agreed that the transfer station should open at 1:00 o'clock p.m. on Saturday, August 11th. Mr. Heward will post the required and proper notices.

CLAIMS: Moved by Commissioner Estep, seconded by Commissioner Hoybjerg, to approve the claims as presented. Carried.
