



POWER COUNTY COMMISSIONER MINUTES

The Board of Power County Commissioners met in special session on Tuesday, February 11, 2003. Present were Commissioner Ken Estep, Chairman, Vicki L. Meadows and Ray Zimmerman. Also present was Power County Clerk Christine Steinlicht.

SHOSHONE-BANNOCK TRIBE – FORT HALL LAND USE POLICY OPERATIVE GUIDELINES: The Board of Power County Commissioners participated in a telephone conference call with officials from the FMC Corporation, the U. S. Department of Energy (DOE), Idaho National Engineering & Environmental Laboratories (INEEL), J. R. Simplot Don Plant, Idaho Trucker Association, Union Pacific Railroad, Bannock County, Bingham County, City of Pocatello, City of Blackfoot, City of Chubbuck, Senator Craig's Office, Senator Crapo's office, and Congressman Simpson's office to discuss the recent amendments to the Fort Hall Land Use Policy Operative Guidelines dealing with the storage and/or transport of hazardous waste materials within the boundaries of the Fort Hall Indian Reservation and establishing a transport fee retroactive to 1998. The parties also discussed developing common written response to be submitted to the Shoshone-Bannock Tribe's Land Use Committee prior to the closing of the comment period on February 24, 2003. Following further discussion, it was agreed that the Counties would file a joint comment, to be prepared by Bannock County attorney Rod Hall; however, all written comments will be shared with the entire group via e-mail. A follow up telephone conference call is scheduled for Tuesday, February 18<sup>th</sup>, 2003, at 3:30 p.m. The group will also attempt to arrange a meeting with the Fort Hall Business Council and the Fort Hall Land Board to discuss the proposed amendments.
