POWER COUNTY COMMISSIONER MINUTES

The Board of Power County Commissioners met in regular session on Monday, November 10th, 2008. Present were Commissioners Vicki Meadows, Chairman, Ken Estep and Ron Funk. Also present were Power County Clerk Christine Steinlicht and Power County Prosecuting Attorney F. Randall Kline.

<u>POWER COUNTY TREASURER – DELINQUENT PERSONAL PROPERTY TAXES</u> (<u>WARRANTS OF DISTRAINT</u>): Power County Sheriff Jim Jeffries and Civil Deputy Gaylene Cardona appeared before the Commissioners with Chief Deputy Treasurer Carol Whitnah to discuss the Warrants of Distraint pending for collection of personal property taxes owed on the following parcels:

Following discussion, it was moved by Commissioner Meadows, seconded by Commissioner Estep, to proceed with Sheriff's sale on the aforementioned parcels, and to execute the standard letter of instructions to the Power County Sheriff as prepared by Power County Treasurer Bobbie Mauch. Carried.

<u>POWER COUNTY BOARD OF CANVASSERS (I.C. #34-1205) – 2008 GENERAL ELECTION:</u> The Board of Power County Commissioners then met as the Power County Board of Canvassers pursuant to I.C. #34-1205. Following discussion, it was moved by Commissioner Meadows, seconded by Commissioner Estep, to approve and certify the

2008 General Election results as presented by Power County Clerk Chris Steinlicht. Carried. (SEE ATTACHED).

<u>POWER COUNTY MOSQUITO ABATEMENT DISTRICT - STATE TAX COMMISSION CERTIFICATION (I.C. #63-215)</u>: Following a review of I.C. #63-215, it was moved by Commissioner Meadows, seconded by Commissioner Estep, to instruct Power County Prosecuting Attorney F. Randall Kline to prepare the appropriate Resolution to certify the Power County Mosquito Abatement District as a legal taxing entity within Power County, Idaho. Carried. This matter was tabled until November 24th, 2008.

<u>SIXTH DISTRICT JUVENILE DETENTION FACILITY (EXPANSION) – POWER COUNTY RESOLUTION #2008-08</u>: Commissioner Meadows announced that it was the date and time scheduled for consideration of proposed Power County Resolution #2008-08, a resolution authorizing the filing of a Petition for Judicial confirmation under Title 7, Chapter 13, Idaho Code. There being no public objection, it was moved by Commissioner Funk, seconded by Commissioner Meadows, to approve and adopt Power County Resolution #2008-08. Carried.

<u>COMMISSIONER MINUTES</u>: Moved by Commissioner Meadows, seconded by Commissioner Funk, to approve the Power County Commissioner Minutes for October 14th, 23rd and 27th, 2008, as presented. Carried.

BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT (BLM) – MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (GATEWAY WEST TRANSMISSION LINES): Following discussion, it was moved by Commissioner Meadows, seconded by Commissioner Funk, to approve and execute the Memorandum of Understanding between Power County and the Bureau of Land Management regarding the development of an environmental impact statement for the Gateway West Transmission Line Project as presented by the United State Department of Interior. Carried.

<u>SECURE RURAL SCHOOLS – POWER COUNTY RESOLUTION #2009-01:</u> Following discussion, it was moved by Commissioner Meadows, seconded by Commissioner Estep, to approve and execute Power County Resolution #2009-01 for National Forest related safety-net payments a/k/a Secure Rural Schools for Federal Fiscal Year 2008 as presented. Carried.

<u>COUNTY BOARDS</u>: The Commissioners reviewed the appointments that will need to be made in January, 2009, to fill vacancies on the various County Boards. The Commissioners agreed to contact the Chairman of each Board that they oversee to discuss the desires and/or suggestions for filling those vacancies. This matter was tabled until December 8th, 2008.

<u>U.S. FOREST SERVICE – CARIBOU TAGHEE NATIONAL FOREST</u>: Jeff Hammes, District Supervisor at the U.S. Forest Service appeared before the Commissioners to

report that he will be the contact person on all issues related to the U.S. Forest Service and/or Caribou Taghee National Forest.

<u>POWER COUNTY PERSONNEL MANUAL – VACATION/COMPENSATORY CARRY-OVER:</u> The Commissioners reviewed the County's accrual register of vacation and compensatory time being carried by each Power County employee. Following discussion, the Commissioners agreed to send a memorandum to County employees reminding them of the maximum accrual carry-overs allowed under the Power County Personnel Manual. This matter was tabled until January 12th, 2009.

<u>POWER COUNTY TRANSFER STATION/LANDFILL – ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE</u>: The Commissioners reviewed the Customer Balance Summary Report of receivables that are billed monthly through the Power County Clerk's Office to collect past due accounts for Power County Transfer Station/Landfill services. Following discussion, it was moved by Commissioner Estep, seconded by Commissioner Meadows, to write off the following accounts receivable as "uncollectible" and to issue the appropriate IRS Cancellation of Debt 1099-C Forms for calendar year 2008:


POWER COUNTY SHERIFF – JAIL MASTER PLAN: Power County Sheriff Jim Jeffries appeared before the Commissioners to discuss Power County's jail master plan by Rocky Mountain Corrections. The Commissioners then reviewed the letter dated October 28th, 2008, from Brent Reinke, Director of the Idaho Department of Corrections, to Power County Sheriff Jim Jeffries regarding inmate population changes and the additional beds that the State of Idaho will be putting on line over the next three years. Following discussion, the Commissioners and Sheriff Jeffries agreed to remove this matter as an agenda item and allow the State to submit a proposal if and when they become interested in housing state inmates at the local level.
