

POWER COUNTY COMMISSIONER MINUTES

The Board of Power County Commissioners met in regular session on Monday, November 8th, 2010. Present were Commissioners Vicki Meadows, Chairman, Ken Estep and Ron Funk. Also present were Power County Clerk Christine Steinlicht, Power County Prosecuting Attorney F. Randall Kline and Power County Commissioner-Elect Delane Anderson.

2010 GENERAL ELECTION – BOARD OF CANVASSERS (I.C. #34-1205): The Board of Power County Commissioners met as the Board of Canvassers pursuant to I.C. #34-1205. Following discussion, it was moved by Commissioner Estep, seconded by Commissioner Funk, to approve the 2010 General Election Abstract prepared by Power County Clerk Chris Steinlicht as presented. Carried. (SEE ATTACHED).

JUNIOR COLLEGE – CERTIFICATES OF RESIDENCY: Following discussion, it was moved by Commissioner Meadows, seconded by Commissioner Funk, to approve the Certificates of Residency as submitted by the College of Southern Idaho. Carried.

POWER COUNTY COMMUNICATIONS – PAPS MOUNTAIN REPEATER SITE (LYNN SCHERER AND MARK SCHERER EASEMENT): Commissioner Funk reported that since the City of American Falls does not require access to the Paps Mountain repeater site, they will not be a party to the Access & Easement Agreement with Lynn Scherer and Mark Scherer. Power County Prosecuting Attorney Randy Kline reported that he has amended the Access & Easement Agreement to exclude the City of American Falls and will be obtaining the required signatures. Following discussion, the Commissioners agreed to table further discussion of this matter until November 22nd, 2010.

LANCE FUNK D/B/A PLEASANT VALLEY AVIATION – DELINQUENT PERSONAL PROPERTY TAXES: Following discussion with Power County Prosecuting Attorney Randy Kline, the Commissioners agreed to table further consideration of this matter until November 22nd, 2010.

FORT HALL INDIAN RESERVATION – JURISDICTION ISSUES (LAW ENFORCEMENT): Power County Prosecuting Attorney Randy Kline appeared before the Commissioners to discuss law enforcement and other jurisdictional issues within the common boundaries of the Fort Hall Indian Reservation and Power County. Following discussion, the Commissioners and Mr. Kline agreed that the Power County Prosecuting Attorney should immediately address and document each and every report or complaint of law enforcement jurisdiction violations by the Shoshone Bannock Tribes in writing to the Fort Hall Business Council, Echohawk Law Offices and Tribal Attorney Bill Bacon. Following further discussion, it was moved by Commissioner Estep, seconded by Commissioner Meadows, to approve and execute the letter to the Idaho Department of

Transportation regarding Shoshone Bannock Tribal Court Traffic Citations, which was prepared by Power County's Special Counsel Douglas J. Balfour. Carried.

POWER COUNTY TRANSFER STATION/LANDFILL – WOOD GRINDING CONTRACT: Zane Buffi d/b/a Backatcha, LLC, appeared before the Commissioners to review and discuss any concerns with his proposed contract for wood grinding services at the Power County Transfer Station/Landfill. Also present was Power County Transfer Station/Landfill supervisor Craig Heward. At the outset, the Commissioners advised Mr. Buffi that Southeast Idaho Solid Waste has been contracted to provide wood grinding and hauling services to the Power County Landfill for the remainder of the season. Following further discussion, the Commissioners suggested that Mr. Heward, Mr. Buffi and Prosecuting Attorney Kline negotiate a proposed contract for the 2011 season and this matter was tabled until February 28th, 2011.

POWER COUNTY DISTRICT COURT – MENTAL HEALTH PROTECTIVE HOLDS: Power County Prosecuting Attorney Randy Kline presented the Commissioners with a copy of the proposed contract between Power County and Joyce E. Carson, LCPC, to perform psychological evaluations and prepare designated examiner certificates for individuals in mental health protective custody. Following discussion, the Commissioners agreed that several minor, technical changes should be made to the proposed contract and this matter was tabled until November 22nd, 2010.

506-508 GIFFORD AVENUE (DUPLEX PROPERTY) – EMERGENCY SHELTER: The Commissioners reviewed the request of the current occupant of 506-508 Gifford to rent the duplex on a long-term basis. Following discussion, the Commissioners agreed that the Gifford Duplex property is available only for short term, emergency use on a case-by-case basis and that the current occupants, who have been sheltered since September 27th, 2010, will need to obtain alternate housing.

COUNTY BOARDS: The Commissioners reviewed the appointments that will need to be made in January, 2011, to fill vacancies on the various County Boards. The Commissioners agreed to contact the Chairpersons of each Board that they oversee to discuss the desires and/or suggestions for filling those vacancies. This matter was tabled until December 13th, 2010.

POWER COUNTY PERSONNEL MANUAL – VACATION/COMPENSATORY CARRY-OVER: The Commissioners reviewed the County's accrual register of vacation and compensatory time being carried by each Power County employee. Following discussion, the Commissioners agreed to send a memorandum to County employees reminding them of the maximum accrual carry-overs allowed under the Power County Personnel Manual. This matter was tabled until January 10th, 2011.

COMMISSIONER MINUTES: Moved by Commissioner Meadows, seconded by Commissioner Funk, to approve the Power County Commissioner Minutes for October 12th and 25th, 2010, as presented. Carried.

CLAIMS: Moved by Commissioner Estep, seconded by Commissioner Meadows, to approve the claims as presented, amended and supplemented with the understanding that the Sheriff's Office claim for the 2009 Yamaha Jet Ski in the amount of \$7,833, to be paid via a contribution from Bannock County's boat and registration fees to the Power County Waterways, will be treated as matching funds for Power County's 2011 Marine Patrol grant through the Idaho Department of Parks & Recreation. Carried.


