

POWER COUNTY COMMISSIONER MINUTES

The Board of Power County Commissioners met in regular session on August 6, 2001. Present were Commissioners Ken Estep, Chairman, Valerie Hoybjerg and Janet S. Chapman. Also present were Power County Chief Deputy Clerk Linda Annen and Power County Prosecuting Attorney Paul Laggis.

MAGISTRATE COURT AND CLERK'S OFFICE: Power County Magistrate Judge Mark Beebe and deputy clerk Sharee Sprague appeared before the Commissioners to discuss the additional work created due to an employee's absence for medical purposes. Following discussion, it was moved by Commissioner Estep, seconded by Commissioner Hoybjerg, to allow Magistrate Court Deputy Clerks Sharee Sprague and Gina Flores to work an additional five hour per week during the medical absence of Emma Nye with the understanding that the Magistrate Court Deputy Clerks and the Clerk's Office work together in an attempt to keep Magistrate Court caught up without requiring any additional hours. 
POWER COUNTY SHERIFF INMATE LABOR DETAIL (SCILD): Following discussion with Power County Sheriff Howard Sprague, the Commissioners approved Sheriff's Sprague's request to use the SCILD bus to transport Veterans from and from the Fairgrounds on August 24th and 25th, 2001.

PLANNING & ZONING APPEALS: Power County Special Prosecuting Attorney Guy Price suggested that the Power County Commissioners get together with Power County Prosecuting Attorney Paul Laggis to develop a policy on copying tapes from public meetings. The Commissioners will discuss this matter with Prosecuting Attorney Laggis.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: Moved by Commissioner Hoybjerg, seconded by Commissioner Estep, to move into executive session pursuant to I.C. #67-2345 to discuss potential legal problems. Carried.

PLANNING & ZONING – PUBLIC HEARING ON REZONING: At 7:00 o'clock p.m. Commissioner Estep reported that it was the time and date set for public hearing on the Power County Planning & Zoning Commission's approval of the re-zoning application submitted by Kendell Ranches to re-zone 30 acres on the Rockland Highway #37 in Section 7, Township 8 South, Range 31 East from agricultural to light industrial. Following public comment and a review of the exhibits submitted, it was moved by Commissioner Hoybjerg, seconded by Commissioner Chapman, that Commissioner deliberation be continued until August 13, 2001, at 2:00 o'clock p.m. Carried.
