

POWER COUNTY COMMISSIONER MINUTES

The Board of Power County Commissioners met in regular session on Monday, June 6th, 2005. Present were Commissioners Vicki Meadows and Ray Zimmerman. Also present were Power County Clerk Christine Steinlicht and Power County Prosecuting Attorney Paul Laggis.

POWER COUNTY COURTHOUSE – EXPANSION/REMODEL: Keeven Shropshire of JHS Architects appeared before the Commissioners to discuss fire safety rating of the Courthouse expansion project. Also present were American Falls Fire Chief Gary Ferguson and American Falls Building Inspector Jeff Nelson. Mr. Ferguson indicated that he is hesitant to sign off on a fire safety plan that does not include a ceiling sprinkler system; however, Mr. Shropshire feels that a fire sprinkling system is not required for historical buildings unless the renovation project increases the threat to human life and safety. Following discussion, the parties agreed to refer the fire requirement questions to District 3 Deputy State Fire Marshal Terry Edwards. This matter was tabled until June 13th, 2005.

MINUTES: Moved by Commissioner Meadows, seconded by Commissioner Zimmerman, to approve the Power County Commissioners Minutes for May 2nd, 9th and 23rd, 2005, as presented. Carried.



POWER COUNTY DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY – FMC SITE: Power County Development Authority Board members Kent Rudeen, Bill Meadows and Brett Crompton appeared before the Commissioners with FMC representatives John Bartholomew and Liz Davis. Also present was Remesh Raman of Southeast Idaho Energy who presented a Power Point presentation of Idaho Power's future energy needs and why Integrated Gasification Combined Cycle (IGCC) could efficiently and economically fill those needs with minimal environmental impact.
