

## POWER COUNTY COMMISSIONER MINUTES

The Board of Power County Commissioners met in regular session on Monday, May 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2011. Present were Commissioners Vicki Meadows, Chairman, Ron Funk and Delane Anderson. Also present were Power County Clerk Christine Steinlicht and Power County Prosecuting Attorney F. Randall Kline.

### POWER COUNTY TREASURER – TAX DEEDED PARCELS (PUBLIC AUCTION):

The Board of Commissioners then attended the public auction conducted by Power County Treasurer Deanna Curry on the following parcels:

Following public auction, it was moved by Commissioner Meadows, seconded by Commissioner Funk, to approve, execute and record the appropriate Quitclaim Deed transferring ownership of Power County Parcel #RPB106-00. Carried. Following further discussion, Treasurer Curry agreed to review Power County's options with regard to Parcel #RPA1372-03 and this matter was tabled until June 13<sup>th</sup>, 2011.

POWER COUNTY BOARD OF CANVASSERS (I.C. #34-1205) – CONSOLIDATED ELECTION: The Board of Power County Commissioners met as a Board of Canvassers pursuant to I.C. #34-1205. Following discussion, it was moved by Commissioner Meadows, seconded by Commissioner Anderson, to approve the Election Abstract for the May 17<sup>th</sup>, 2011, consolidated election prepared and presented by Power County Clerk Chris Steinlicht. Carried. (SEE ATTACHED).

POWER COUNTY AIRPORT – GRANT/BUDGET: Commissioner Anderson reported that he contacted William Statham of the Idaho Division of Aeronautics to discuss the status of Power County's Grant Award executed by the parties on November 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2010, in the amount of \$19,500. Mr. Statham has assured Commissioner Anderson that the grant funds should be received by Power County within the next ten days. Following discussion, the Commissioners reiterated their concerns with this grant being so critically delayed and agreed that the Airport Board should continue to submit claims only for absolutely necessary expenses and this matter was tabled until June 13<sup>th</sup>, 2011.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT – EVENT PARK (POWER COUNTY AIRPORT): The Commissioners and Power County Prosecuting Attorney Randy Kline then discussed a recent proposal to utilize the Power County Airport as an event park for off-street racing enthusiasts to gather and compete. At the outset, Prosecutor Kline presented the Commissioners with a draft contract/agreement to use the Airport for special events, as well as a list of criteria, conditions and fees for use. Following discussion, the Commissioners agreed that they would need additional time to review the proposed agreement and this matter was tabled until June 13<sup>th</sup>, 2011, with the understanding that no further non-aviation related events will be scheduled or conducted unless and until the Board of Commissioners authorizes use of the Airport property for events.

PUBLIC HEARING – POWER COUNTY RESOLUTION #2011-02 (OPENING FISCAL YEAR 2011 BUDGET): Commissioner Meadows announced that it was the date and time scheduled for public hearing on proposed Power County Resolution #2011-02. There being no public objection, it was moved by Commissioner Meadows, seconded by Commissioner Funk, to approve and execute Power County Resolution #2011-02 and instruct Power County Auditor Chris Steinlicht to reopen Power County's fiscal year 2011 budget to transfer \$12,062 from the Justice Fund's Juvenile justice Department to the Justice Fund's Prosecutor's Office, to be budgeted as follows:

- \$12,062 Increase to Prosecutor Secretarial Salary (08-03-406-00)
- \$12,062 Decrease to Juvenile Justice Diversion/Attendance Salary (08-09-405-00)

which transfer will satisfy the budgetary provisions of that Settlement Agreement between the Board of Power County Commissioners and Prosecuting Attorney Randy Kline dated January 24<sup>th</sup>, 2011, and amended by interlineation on April 28<sup>th</sup>, 2011. Carried.

POWER COUNTY PROSECUTING ATTORNEY – CRIMINAL PROSECUTIONS: Power County Prosecuting Attorney Randy Kline appeared before the Commissioners to discuss fees and compensation for witnesses who appear for Court proceedings in Power County under the power of subpoena. Following discussion, the Commissioners agreed that it is absolutely the duty of the Prosecuting Attorney to determine witnesses for prosecution and, as such, all witness fees and compensation are properly included as an expenditure line in the Prosecutor's budget. Following questioning by Chairman Meadows, Prosecuting Attorney Kline confirmed that Tom Henesh d/b/a Indian Springs Natatorium had received a properly issued subpoena to testify in Power County on April 8<sup>th</sup>, 2011; accordingly, the request of Tom Henesh d/b/a Indian Springs Natatorium for additional compensation, which was taken under advisement by the Board of Commissioner on May 5<sup>th</sup>, 2011, will not be given further consideration, since the Board of Commissioners is unwilling and unable to provide compensation for witness fees beyond the statutory limits of Idaho Code or Power County's budget.

POWER COUNTY TRANSFER STATION/LANDFILL – DEMOLITION PIT: Commissioner Anderson reported that he had met with Engineer Neil Morgan, Rodney Burch of Dioptra Geometrics and Power County Transfer Station/Landfill Supervisor

Craig Heward to discuss a "scope of service" for the construction of an additional demolition pit at the Power County Landfill, including the following:

- Amending/creating an operation plan for future cells, including cell height, placement of concrete materials in a separate area to gain capacity and recommendations on future implementation of agency rules.
- Annual site monitoring to allow management of the landfill based on historic observations and allow future planning and life cycle predictions.
- Assist in the creation of financial assurance documents.

Commissioner Anderson then reported that copies of the "scope of service" will be provided to the Board prior to their June 13<sup>th</sup>, 2011, meeting. Commissioner Anderson further reported that Anderson Construction is scheduled to commence construction of the new demolition pit as soon as weather permits; however, Mr. Morgan and Mr. Burch believe that Power County will need a long term solution to deal with the resulting excess dirt piles and a plan to cap the existing cells with concrete demolition. Following discussion, the Commissioners agreed to table further consideration of this matter until June 13<sup>th</sup>, 2011.

POWER COUNTY INVESTMENT COMMITTEE – MULTI BANK SECURITIES, INC.: Power County Treasurer Deanna Curry and the Board of Power County Commissioners then met as the Power County Investment Committee pursuant to Power County Resolution #2007-02. Treasurer Curry presented the Commissioners' with a "Confirmation Report" from Multi-Securities Bank, Inc., indicating that the FHLB Quarterly Bond, with a maturity date of May 12<sup>th</sup>, 2015, was "called" and "rolled over" as directed by the Power County Investment Committee on May 10<sup>th</sup>, 2011.

POWER COUNTY TREASURER – WARRANTS OF DISTRAINT: Power County Treasurer Deanna Curry appeared before the Commissioners to discuss disposal of Parcel #MHZ0096-00, which is a trailer house that was acquired by Power County through a Warrant of Distraint. At the outset, Power County Prosecuting Attorney Randy Kline reported that the owner of the real property upon which the trailer house is situated has agreed that the structure should be removed from his premises. Following discussion, the Commissioners suggested that Treasurer Curry obtain quotes to have the trailer house removed from its current site and this matter was tabled until June 6<sup>th</sup>, 2011.

POWER COUNTY TREASURER – TAX DEEDED PROPERTY: Power County Treasurer Deanna Curry appeared before the Commissioners to discuss Parcel #RPA0812-00, which is owned by Power County pursuant to Tax Deed. At the outset, Power County Prosecuting Attorney Randy Kline reported that the County's Bankruptcy Attorney Craig Christensen has a motion pending before the U.S. Bankruptcy Court to clarify all outstanding issues regarding right, title and interest in the real property and will keep Power County advised as the action proceeds through the Court. Prosecutor Kline further reported that Power County Building Administrator Robert Steinlicht and City of American Falls Building Administrator Jeff Nelson have inspected the premises to determine whether the integrity of the building is adequate to allow access to board up all

open windows. Following discussion, the Commissioners agreed to contact Power County Sheriff Jim Jeffries and arrange for the SCILD crew to enter and fully secure the premises, both doors and windows, to prevent public access and/or further deterioration to the structure. The Commissioners further agreed to contact Power County Weed Department Supervisor Curtis Munk and arrange for the exterior areas of Parcel #RPA0812-00 to be sprayed for noxious weed control.

COMPUTER ARTS, INC. (CAI) – PROPERTY AND TAX MANAGEMENT SYSTEM: Shane Harris, Bret Hill, Bryan Kopp and Jonathan Huse of Computer Arts, Inc., appeared before the Commissioners to present a proposal to convert Power County to CAI's Property and Tax Management System. Also present were Power County Assessor Douglas Glascock, Power County Clerk Chris Steinlicht and Power County Treasurer Deanna Curry. Following discussion, the Commissioners, Assessor Glascock, Clerk Steinlicht and Treasurer Curry agreed that the State's current UAD system will become unavailable within the next two years, and that the CAI product is becoming the preferred property tax management system in the State of Idaho. Following discussion, it was moved by Commissioner Meadows, seconded by Commissioner Anderson, to approve and accept the Property and Tax Management System Proposal presented by Computer Arts, Inc. Carried.

SOUTHEASTERN DISTRICT HEALTH DEPARTMENT – FISCAL YEAR 2012 ANNUAL BUDGET HEARING: Following discussion, it was agreed that Commissioner Meadows would attend the Southeastern District Health Department's Fiscal Year 2012 Budget Committee and Public Hearing on behalf of Power County, to be held at the Golden Star Restaurant in Blackfoot, Idaho, on Thursday, May 26<sup>th</sup>, 2011, at 12:00 noon.

POWER COUNTY COMMISSIONER MINUTES: Moved by Commissioner Meadows, seconded by Commissioner Funk, to approve the Power County Commissioner Minutes for April 11<sup>th</sup>, 25<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup>, and May 3<sup>rd</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup>, 2011, as presented. Carried. Moved by Commissioner Anderson, seconded by Commissioner Funk, to approve the Power County Commissioner Minutes for May 16<sup>th</sup>, 2011, as presented. Carried.

POWER COUNTY BOARD OF EQUALIZATION (I.C. #63-501): The Board of Power County Commissioners then met as the Power County Board of Equalization pursuant to I.C. #63-501. There being no business to come before the Board, the Power County Board of Equalization recessed until June 27<sup>th</sup>, 2011.

POWER COUNTY ADULT MISDEMEANOR PROBATION – POLICY & PROCEDURE MANUAL (SIXTH DISTRICT ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER #2011-02): Kim Helmandollar of Power County Misdemeanor Probation, Inc., appeared before the Commissioners by speaker telephone to review the draft “Power County Standards for Adult Misdemeanor Services and Professional Responsibilities”. At the outset, Mr. Helmandollar reported that the draft manual is being provided pursuant to Sixth District Administrative Order #2011-02, which requires that each misdemeanor probation department in the Sixth Judicial District establish a policies and procedures manual for adult misdemeanor services. Following discussion, the Commissioners agreed that they would need additional time to review the proposed manual and further consideration of this matter was tabled until June 13<sup>th</sup>, 2011.

POWER COUNTY MISDEMEANOR PROBATION – MISDEMEANOR PROBATION SERVICES AGREEMENT (FISCAL YEAR 2012): Kim Helmandollar of Power County Adult Misdemeanor Probation, Inc., appeared before the Commissioners by speaker telephone to discuss renewal of the Misdemeanor Probation Services Agreement for fiscal year 2012. Mr. Helmandollar reported that he will prepare the draft renewal agreement for the Commissioners’ review and this matter was tabled until July 11<sup>th</sup>, 2011.

POWER COUNTY MISDEMEANOR PROBATION – BUILDING USE AGREEMENT (528 GIFFORD): Kim Helmandollar of Power County Adult Misdemeanor Probation, Inc., appeared before the Commissioners by speaker telephone to inquire whether the property acquisition being considered by the Board would impact the Adult Misdemeanor Probation’s occupancy of Power County’s property at 528 Gifford Street. Following discussion, the Commissioners assured Mr. Helmandollar that Power County would continue to provide appropriate and adequate office space for Power County Adult Misdemeanor Probation, Inc.

EXECUTIVE SESSION (I.C. #67-2345): Moved by Commissioner Meadows, seconded by Commissioner Funk, to move into executive session pursuant to I.C. #67-2345 to consider records that are exempt from disclosure under Chapter 3, Title 9, Idaho Code, specifically indigent medical applications. Upon a call for the question, the following roll call vote was taken:

Carried.

INDIGENT CASE #2011-19-I: Moved by Commissioner Meadows, seconded by Commissioner Anderson, to deny indigent medical application #2011-19-I, since applicant is not a resident of Power County as provided in I.C. #31-3505(22), since the application was processed as incomplete under I.C. #31-3505(A)(1) and since applicant has other resources sufficient to pay the medical expenses incurred as provided by I.C. #31-3502(17). Carried.

INDIGENT CASE #2011-17-I: Moved by Commissioner Meadows, seconded by Commissioner Anderson, to approve indigent medical application #2011-17-I. Carried.

INDIGENT CASE #2011-22-I: Moved by Commissioner Meadows, seconded by Commissioner Anderson, to deny indigent medical application #2011-22-I, since applicant is not a resident of Power County as provided in I.C. #31-3505(22) and since application was processed as incomplete under I.C. #31-3505(A). Carried.

U.S. SENATOR JIM RISCHE – STATUS CONFERENCE: Jeremy Field of U. S. Senator Jim Risch’s Pocatello office appeared before the Commissioners via speaker telephone to discuss federal legislative issues pertinent to Power County. At the outset, Mr. Field reiterated Senator Risch’s intent to maintain close contact with the Board of Commissioners to ensure that Power County’s needs and concerns get promptly addressed. Mr. Field then reported on his recent meeting with the Bureau of Land Management to discuss the Mountain States Transmission Intertie Project, which creates a transmission line that goes from Montana, through Power County, Idaho, and west to the Midpoint Substation near Jerome, as follows:

- Despite the entire Idaho Congressional Delegation’s repeated requests, the Bureau of Land Management has determined that no further consideration or study will be given to the route proposed through the Craters of the Moon National Monument, also referred to as “the gap”.
- NorthWestern Energy indicated that they intend to begin meeting with individual landowners to discuss compensation, at which point Mr. Field conveyed Senator Risch insistence that compensation be fair and adequate.

Following discussion, the Commissioners and Mr. Field agreed that the only other recourse available to aggrieved groups or individuals may be legal civil action.

POWER COUNTY AMBULANCE DISTRICT: Moved by Commissioner Funk, seconded by Commissioner Anderson, to recess as Power County Board of Commissioners and reconvene as Power County Ambulance District Board. Carried.

AMBULANCE: Royce Barton of Rocky Mountain Ambulance Sales appeared before the Commissioner by speaker telephone to discuss the purchase of a new ambulance by the Power County Ambulance District and a possible trade-in of current vehicle(s). Also present was Power County Ambulance District Director Di Jones. Following discussion, the Commissioners agreed to review this matter further during the fiscal year 2012 budget process.

Moved by Commissioner Meadows, seconded by Commissioner Funk, to recess as Power County Ambulance District Board and reconvene as Power County Board of Commissioners. Carried.

DISASTER SERVICES – HOMELAND SECURITY GRANT REPORTS: Following discussion with Power County Disaster Services Director Di Jones, it was moved by Commissioner Meadows, seconded by Commissioner Funk, to approve the following Homeland Security Financial Status Reports:

- 2010 EMPG Financial Status Report and Reimbursement Request.
- 2009 HSGP Financial Status Report, Fund Tracker and Balance Sheet.
- 2008 HSGP Financial Status Report, Reimbursement Request, Fund Tracker and Balance Sheet.
- 2007 HSGP Financial Status Report, Fund Tracker and Balance Sheet.

Carried.

POWER COUNTY BUILDING & GROUNDS – PARKING LOTS/SIDEWALK REPAIRS: The Commissioners reviewed the estimate obtained by Power County Building & Grounds Supervisor Gary Thomson to repair several areas of damage to sidewalks and driveway approaches on County property adjacent to the Power County Courthouse and Annex. Following discussion, the Commissioners agreed that a portion of the repairs may be covered under Power County's liability insurance policy with the Idaho Counties Risk Management Program (ICRMP) and instructed Power County Clerk Chris Steinlicht to submit an appropriate claim; accordingly further consideration of this matter was tabled until June 13<sup>th</sup>, 2011.

POWER COUNTY BUILDINGS & GROUNDS – PROPERTY MANAGEMENT PROPOSALS (506-508 GIFFORD DUPLEX PROPERTY): The Commissioners again reviewed the property management proposals submitted by organizations or individuals to manage Power County's idle properties. Also present were Launa Snow d/b/a Snow Property Management, Kay Stillwell d/b/a Calder Street Apartments and Power County resident Dan Neu. At the outset, Commissioner Anderson reported that both units of the Gifford Duplex property will be occupied for the next six (6) months pursuant to Lease Agreements between Power County and Idaho Pocatello Mission (506 Gifford Lease Agreement executed by the parties on May 18<sup>th</sup>, 2012, and the 508 Gifford Lease Agreement on the Power County Commissioner agenda for June 13<sup>th</sup>, 2011). Public

Input and testimony emphasized the benefits for professional management of Power County's idle properties, as follows:

- To ensure qualified professional management and compliance with all Federal Fair Housing Laws
- To eliminate any conflict of interest, real or perceived, that the Board of Commissioners may encounter, either individually or collectively, in performing on-site inspections and/or enforcement actions
- To allow Power County to benefit from a "network" of property management professionals who share information and historical knowledge
- To ensure that Power County, as a public entity, would not under-cut the local market and compete against the private sector

Commissioner Anderson then reported that Idaho Code #31-807 specifically grants the Board of County Commissioners the power and authority to "preserve, take care of, manage and control" County property. Following discussion, the Commissioners agreed to table further consideration of this matter until June 13<sup>th</sup>, 2011, at 9:00 a.m.

IDEACOM ECSI – TELEPHONE SYSTEM UPGRADE: The Commissioners reviewed the quote submitted by IdeaCom ECSI to upgrade Power County's telephone system to include digital messaging and/or music on hold. Following discussion, the Commissioner agreed to reject any unnecessary telephone system upgrades at this time.


EASTERN POWER FIRE DISTRICT – WILDLAND URBAN INTERFACE FIRE CODE: The Commissioners reviewed the certified letter from the Eastern Power County Fire District dated May 15<sup>th</sup>, 2011, requesting that Power County adopt a Wildland Urban Interface Fire Code within the boundaries of the Eastern Power County Fire District. Following discussion, the Commissioners agreed to schedule a meeting with the Eastern Power County Fire District Board on Monday, June 13<sup>th</sup>, 2011, at 3:30 p.m. to discuss jurisdiction, implementation and enforcement of the proposed Code, and this matter was tabled until that time.

ALCOHOL BEVERAGE LICENSE (I.C. #23-903): Commissioner Meadows announced that it was the date and time scheduled for consideration of a 2010-2011 alcohol beverage license. Following discussion, it was moved by Commissioner Funk, seconded by Commissioner Anderson, to approve the following alcohol beverage license:

#34. Vernessa Rupe d/b/a Rupe's Rockland Café for the sale of bottled or canned beer to be consumed on the premises and not to be consumed on the premises and retail wine.

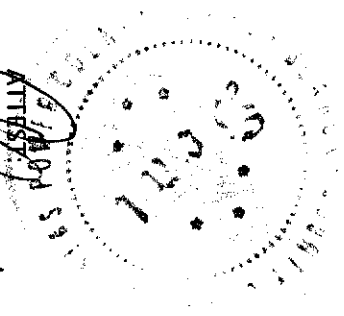
